Our aim remains the same today as it was when we formed in 1928 – through radio technology we are committed to alleviating the isolation and loneliness that sight loss can bring.


I hope you enjoy learning a little more about British Wireless, as I look forward to keeping in touch with each of you.

If you know someone who would benefit from one of our radios please let them know about our work so we can start supporting them straight away.


How do we do it?
