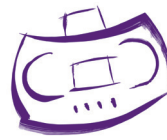

He said: "I used to find it quite difficult using a normal radio. When I first lost my sight everything was alien. But the British Wireless sets are so accessible for the blind.



"When I first got the Sonata it was wonderful. I would recommend BWBF to anyone who's got any kind of sight loss.

"Looking back now I was in a world of darkness, I would jump at every noise, but my radio calmed me down. It really did save my life."
